UPDATE ON RUTHERFORD PARKS LIBRARY AND "BEAM AT THE CLUB" FUNDRAISER

The Alumni Association closed on the purchase of the Library on June 3, 2013.

A fundraising event called "Beam At The Club" was held at the Lebanon Golf and Country Club. Funds were raised for the renovation of the Library. This event was arranged by several members of the Class of 1975 (Frank Bryant, Tom Clemmons, Bill Montgomery, Fred Noe, and Doug Wallace). Tom Clemmons '75, spearheaded the event with the event coordinator, Terri Staroska (a friend of the Alumni Association who volunteered her services). We had ticket sales from over 200 people at \$25 each in advance and \$30 at the door. Tasting stations of Jim Beam products were set up, with a variety of heavy hors d'oeuvres at each station. We had a live auction, and a silent auction. Fred Noe, CHMA '75, 7th generation master distiller of Jim Beam and representatives from Best Brands Distributors were at the event and worked with Tom Clemmons and his committee and Terri Staroska in donating many items to this event and auction. All other items for the auction were donated by Heights alumni and our wonderful generous community. The Alumni Association is so appreciative for everyone's help in making this event so successful. All of us who attended had a great time!!

After all expenses for the event were paid, <u>we netted</u> **\$23,500** for the Library fund. This amount added to the previous donations from our alumni, boosted the total amount of money raised for the Library Fund to \$273,527. We have a total of 247 alumni that have made donations. Our outstanding pledges to the Library fund are \$54,384. With the purchase of the Library and some other minor expenses we have a <u>balance in</u> <u>cash of \$38,184.04 in the Library Fund account</u>.
