Dear Fellow Alumni:

Homecoming for 2014 is scheduled for Saturday, October 11. Again, we are hoping for a large turnout for this year's reunion with class reunions being planned for the classes of **1959, 1964, 1969, 1974, 1979, and 1984.** Please make plans to contact your classmates and encourage them to attend this year. **Information on the class reunions is on page 3 of this newsletter.**

From June 5 to August 12 (since our June 2014 Newsletter) our fundraisers have brought in \$22,960 for the Library Fund, and \$13,476 for the general fund. The three part breakdown of the 240 donors is Library only, 12; general fund only, 144; and both Library and general fund, 84. If you have not sent in your contributions yet, please consider doing so. Please be reminded that your contributions are IRS tax deductible. All of us deeply appreciate the support shown by each contributing alumnus.

The Grant that we requested from the Tennessee Historical Commission did not come through. Our request had been for 60% of \$62,159. The Grant would have paid \$37,295. Though this was a disappointment, we have recently received a number of generous donations to our Library Fund that will assist us with major repairs and renovations.

Our Homecoming events for 2014 on Saturday, October 11, include tours of Main Building (Lebanon City Hall), and the City of Lebanon Museum and History Center located in the basement of Main. City of Lebanon Mayor, Philip Craighead, and his staff are graciously allowing us to visit both of these facilities and we thank them all for their assistance on that Saturday. We will also have the Rutherford Parks Library open in the afternoon after the class pictures have been made. **(See insert on all Homecoming Activities.)**

Registration for Homecoming will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the registration tent behind the Alumni House. Our picnic luncheon will be on the same site. Parking is available behind Main Building, across the street from the Alumni House, and in the parking lot of Rutherford Parks Library. The Alumni House will be open early Saturday morning, October 11, as well as on Friday, October 10, so that you may visit classmates and see the displays inside the house.

Our picnic luncheon will begin at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 11 with Chester Jordan's Catering serving us for the 25th consecutive year. All of you will want to take the opportunity to visit with former faculty and staff who are invited to the luncheon as our guests. The \$15 cost per person will cover your

lunch as well as our guests. **Reservations are required** so that we can give the caterer a correct headcount.

Our morning and afternoon activities should be concluded around 2:30 except for the tour of the Library.

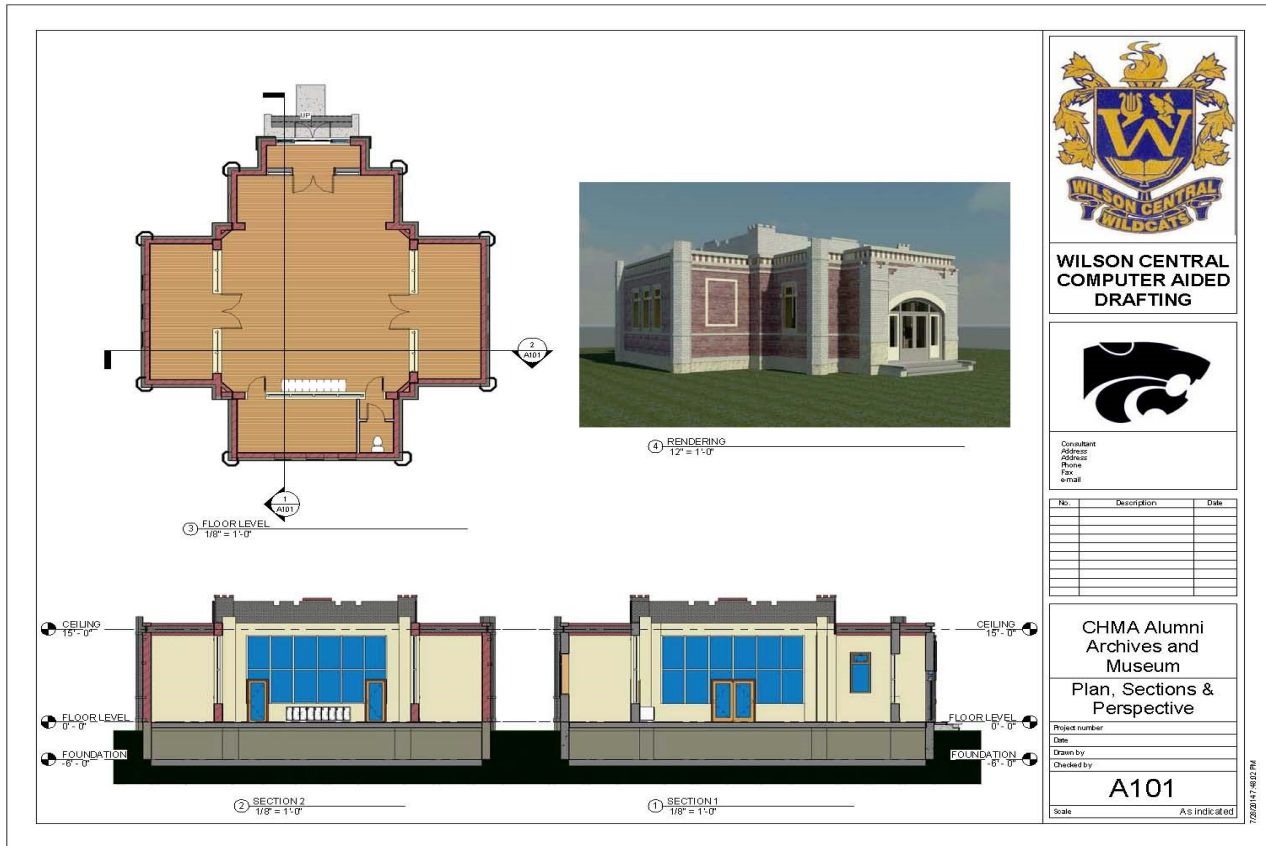
30th REUNION CLASS OF 1984
